
Self Defense Seminar


Task Karate Camping Weekend



Shihan Demura: A Pioneer in Karate

As you know, Shihan Demura will be visiting Task Karate on Monday July 22, 2019. We encourage you to participate in this event. Shihan Demura is one of the pioneers who brought karate from Japan to the rest of the world. Shihan Demura has been training for over 70 years.

Shihan Demura was born on September 15, 1938 in Yokohama, Japan. At the age of 9, he began training in karate and at the age of 12 he started training under Ryusho Sakagami in Itosu-kai karate. Shihan Demura received his Shodan (1st degree blackbelt) in 1956 and won the East Japan Championship in 1957. In 1959, he began training in Okinawan kobudo under the direction of Taira Shinken. In 1965, he was brought to the United States to teach karate. From those roots, Shihan Demura's organization has grown into Genbu-Kai which means professional organization of the martial arts. Genbu-Kai karate currently has several dojos (schools) in California as well as many other states and around the world.

Shihan Demura has traveled the world to provide instruction to thousands in the martial arts. He has provided instruction via magazines, CDs/DVDs and has written several books on karate and kobudo (weapons). Shihan Demura introduced Okinawan kobudo to the United States and is responsible for introducing Kobudo kumite (weapons sparring) to the world. In addition, Shihan

Demura has received numerous awards and recognitions to include a lifetime achievement award by Black Belt Magazine. He has also been the feature of two recent documentaries (i.e., The Real Mr. Miyagi and the Last Dojo). Finally, we look forward to having you meet Shihan Demura this summer when he visits us at Task Karate.

Tournament Tips for Forms/Kata

Are you planning on performing your form at the Coulee Region Free Tournament? If so, we have some tips for you based on Mr. T's years of involvement as a competitor and judge.

- When practicing, break your form into sections and practice each section individually. This helps you get better at each part of your form and improve challenging parts of your form.
- Practice your form slowly and analyze each movement. Juxtapose this with practicing your form full out!
- Think about timing when performing your form. Where do you pause and clearly show your stance? When do you incorporate a kiai?
- Think about your eyes. When competing, think about where you are looking. For example, if you are looking down are you doing so for a specific reason? Think about keeping your eyes on your imaginary opponent when you complete your form.
- During the tournament, be respectful to judges. Yes sir and yes ma'am are expected. Also, you can't over bow.

In addition, little things can make you stand out at tournaments. For example, do you wear a clean uniform with your belt tied neatly? Do you practice presenting yourself to your judges in a manner that you don't fidget? Do you convey an aura of focus?

Finally, remember that true martial artists focus on doing their best. When you do your best, you win regardless of what a judge or judges determine.



Self Defense Updates

Part of the curriculum at Task Karate focuses on self defense.

Recently, a 22 year old burglar entered a home in Belvidere, IL at around 2:15 AM. He crept upstairs to a bedroom whereas a 40

year old woman was sleeping. This burglar crept into the bedroom and placed his hand over the 40 year old woman's mouth. The woman pushed his hand away and screamed. Shortly after, the woman's 68 year old mother entered the scene.

The 68 year old mother entered her daughter's bedroom and grabbed the burglar by the back of the head and drew him off balance. As the burglar fell, the daughter called the police and her mother hit the burglar with a pocket stick in the face and told him to leave.

The burglar fled and was picked up by law enforcement shortly after.

When asked by local media how the 68 year old women knew what to do when facing a burglar...she said, "I'm a martial artist and we train self defense."

Note, the woman's daughter is now enrolled in martial arts as well.



Students looking to focus their training to catapult their growth, work through an area of challenge, and/or learn an area of specialty (e.g., kama, bo, sai, tonfa,

nunchucku, cane, jo, pocket stick, sword) can sign up for private lessons. Private lessons are \$30 per lesson and generally run one hour. Private lessons can also be purchased as a package for \$100 for 4 lessons. See Mr. T. if interested.

Can you count to 20 in Japanese?

Our Japanese word of the month for June was dachi (pronounced dah-chee). Dachi means stance in Japanese. As we know, a quality stance means you have a strong and stable base and is important when practicing basics (kihon), forms (kata), and even in sparring (kumite). This month we will focus on counting in Japanese from 0-20. We practice counting in Japanese in class and you should also practice outside of class.
